



Reaching the Harvest in Crisis Haiti, 2010

Dear Friends,

I continue to rejoice as I look at photos and recall how the Lord worked in Kenya as a result of your prayers for me and the rest of the team. On Sunday, March 7, the Grace Missions Department will be reporting to the congregation and celebrating what the Lord did. I encourage you to attend and rejoice with us.

The reason I am writing is to make you aware of a new door that has opened for me to serve the Lord overseas. Last fall, the Lord miraculously provided finances so I could be trained as a disaster responder as well as receive advanced chaplaincy training. The training I received with Crisis Response Int'l (CRI), a Christian disaster relief organization, changed me and heavily influenced my decision to go to Kenya.

CRI has asked me to deploy with them and serve in Haiti. My heart has been deeply moved by the profound loss of life and the on-going need of the Haitian people who need to know that Jesus loves them. I have received reports from CRI responders detailing what the Lord is doing and I want to be part of this profound work of His Spirit. Please prayerfully consider supporting me financially and in prayer so I can deploy with CRI. CRI has committed to serve Haiti for six months; mid-January through mid-July so I may be able to deploy to Haiti several times. Each deployment will be for two weeks and will cost \$900 (assuming air fare doesn't increase), plus the cost to get from here to Kansas City. I will let you know if I need for additional funding due to changes in transportation costs.) If the Lord prompts you to provide financial support, please make the check payable to **Crisis Response Int'l** and **mail it to me at the address below**. If I receive more than is needed for the first deployment, the funds will be held in an account for me and will be used to cover future deployments.

I would also like to encourage you to visit the CRI website www.criout.com and make a donation to help CRI's relief efforts. CRI operates on a very tight budget to keep the cost as low as possible because the need for responders is great. Most of the \$900 goes to cover transportation. Our meals in country will consist of beans and rice as these are inexpensive and provide complete protein.

Thank you for partnering with me in the past. I look forward to seeing the Lord work in Haiti as a result of your prayers. I will give you the dates of my first deployment once CRI has scheduled me.
